

AROUND PUC:



West Wall Project Update

Just a reminder of where we are headed - The West wall wood will be replaced with steel reinforced aluminum that matches the North and South walls. The goal is to replicate the current wall (with an additional row of glass along the bottom) as the budget will allow, including size of glass panels, size of the bays and the angling of the glass. The Hall Task Force has been scouring the country for suitable replacement glass that meets code while being respectful of the spirit of the current glass. Several members of the Congregation have asked

about plastic as opposed to glass at the last couple of Congregational and Town Hall Meetings. The HTF included plastic in their considerations and have decided on tempered glass. We do know that budget will be the main driver for what we are able to do – the budget will limit the extent to which we are able to replicate the current wall.

Since the last written update, our contracted engineer has finished the calculations for the size and strength of the steel and we have an updated bid from our wall contractor. In addition, the HTF has reviewed countless glass designs and received several selected glass samples as well as some cost estimates. The Facilities Committee and Hall Task Force met with our contractor and engineer on Saturday, March 5th to review the engineering, updated bid and our options.

Our options are going to be limited if we are to stay within budget - which is an absolute must. We are working across the various equities to find a solution that provides an acceptable balance of these equities. We discussed the trade space, and our engineer, contractor and HTF have some more work to do. The engineer and contractor are working an alternate solution to reduce cost. In parallel, the HTF now has a realistic budget to share with glass vendors, and they're continuing their search to find a pleasing solution that we can afford. National UU Action Needed as Libya Erupts in Violence

Over the past few weeks, I (and probably many of you as well) have been reading about the escalating situation in Libya with mounting concern. Every day, reports of more fights, victims, and refugees flood in. We have now reached the point where armed forces are using machine guns and fighter jets against pro-democracy protesters. **Hundreds of Libyans have been killed and, without immediate international action, the situation**

could spiral into a national bloodbath.

The EU and UN are holding emergency sessions to decide on what actions to take. A forceful international response is necessary. Let's flood UN delegations, EU Foreign Ministers and the High Representative for the EU with messages urging them to impose targeted sanctions, asset freezes and a no fly zone that could stop the crackdown.
